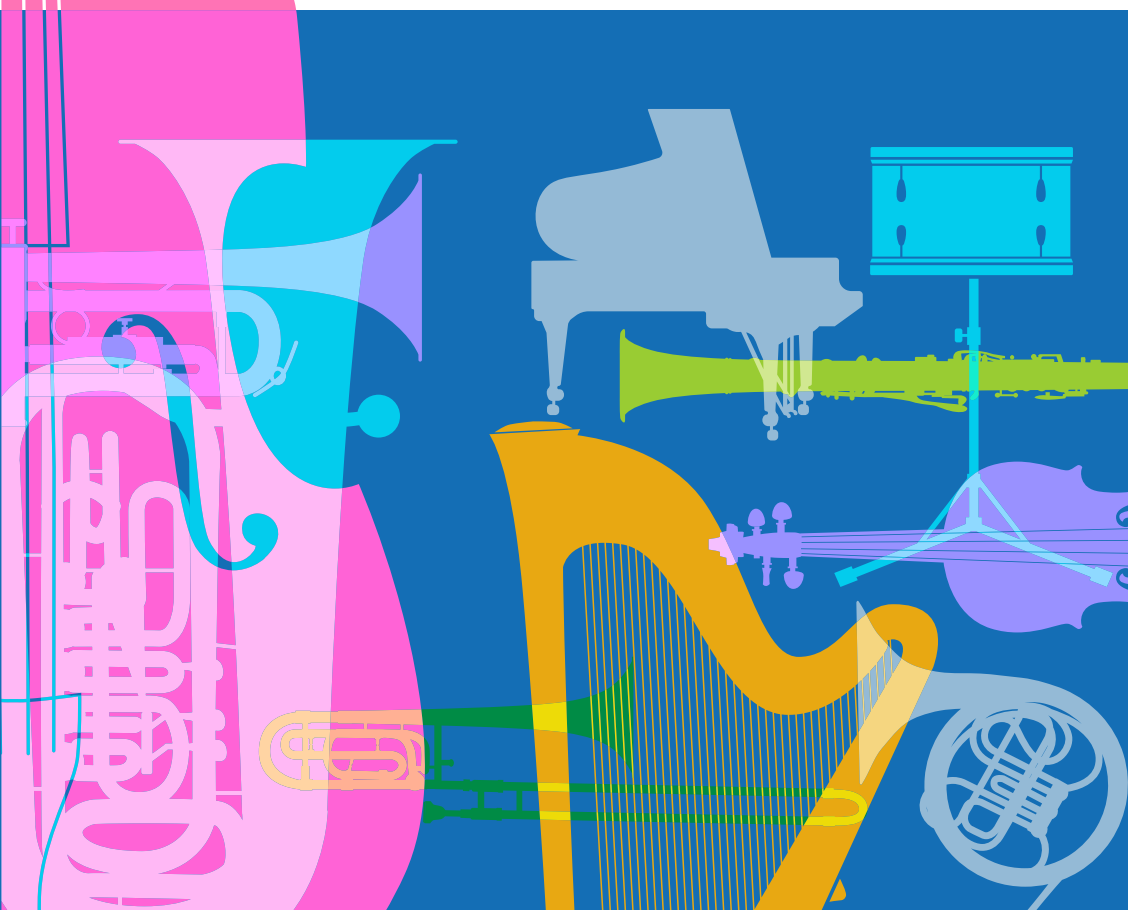

Entering his fifth season as Artistic Director of the Winona Symphony Orchestra, Dr. Erik Rohde maintains a diverse career as a conductor, violinist, and educator, and has performed in recitals and festivals across the United States and in Europe and Asia. He is the Director of Orchestral Activities at the University of Northern Iowa where he conducts the Northern Iowa Symphony Orchestra and the UNI Opera Theater. Prior to his appointment at the University of Northern Iowa, Rohde served as the Director of String Activities and Orchestra at Indiana State University where he conducted the Indiana State University Symphony Orchestra and taught violin, chamber music, and Suzuki pedagogy. Rohde lives in Cedar Falls, IA with his wife Erin and their children.

We introduce the season with a program inspired by the signature collection of Hudson River Valley artists and members of an influential group of composers known familiarly as the Boston Six. A distinctly American program, these string quartets of Amy Beach and George Chadwick use Native American melodies and folk fiddle tunes respectively. Both music and painting sharing a common birthplace in the Northeast, they each influenced the genesis of a truly “American” style during a period of growing awareness of the American identity. Join us as we celebrate the melodic origins and pictorial beauty of the land and pay tribute to the beloved collection of the Hudson River School.

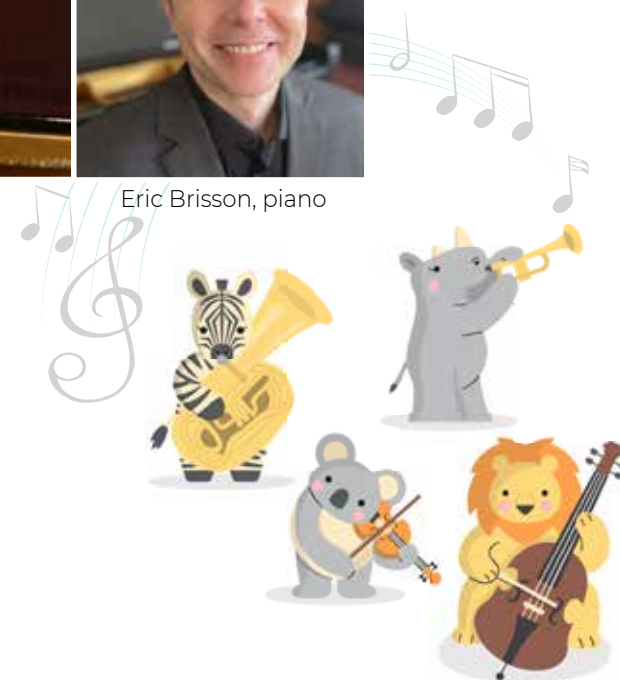
